Who is a Young Leader?

Young Leaders are soybean growers of any age, married or single, who are interested in developing their leadership skills. There is no age limit, however, growers and their spouses must be at least 21 years of age to participate. Spouses are included in all aspects of the program, and the knowledge gained is beneficial in any setting - whether on the farm or off.

What are the Benefits of this Program?

- Young Leaders become valuable, active members of agricultural organizations and volunteer groups at state and local levels.
- Many graduates of the program become officers of their State or National Association Board of Directors.
- Other graduates become recruiters, key committee members, or membership directors.
- Spouses learn more about the farm operation and industry issues that affect soybean growers.
- Participants learn about their personal leadership style and how to achieve a greater level of success in their business or volunteer organizations.
- Networking and camaraderie developed with other producers from 25 states and Canada helps build friendships that last a lifetime.

The Young Leader Program Schedule Commitment

When chosen to represent your state as a Young Leader, participants are asked to commit to attend two phases of training:

PHASE I: December 6-9, 2009 at Pioneer Headquarters in Johnston, Iowa.

PHASE II: March 2-6, 2010 in Anaheim, California, in conjunction with the annual Commodity Classic convention and trade show.

Application Guidelines—Deadline August 31, 2009

- There is no age limit for participation, however growers must be 21 years or older to apply and be selected.
- Any soybean grower may apply for the Young Leader program, however selected participants are required to have a current state soybean association/ASA membership to take part in the program.
- Applicants should be interested in pursuing leadership roles within the soybean industry.
- Spouses do not have to be employed on the farm to participate in this program.
- Single growers may also apply to the program.
- No babies or children may attend any Young Leader program activities.
- If an applicant is newly elected or in his/her first year of service on their State Association Board of Directors, they are eligible to apply; however this program is not designed for Board members with service years beyond the first year.

Please Note: To be eligible for this program, you must commit to attending both phases of training Dec. 6-9, 2009, at Pioneer headquarters in Johnston, IA and March 2-6, 2010 in Anaheim, CA.
